The Creative Society aims to fulfill the democratic goals of the UN by initiating international research projects. Through interdisciplinary research and collective action, participants of the Creative Society project inform and unite people around the world to confront the climate crisis.

WHAT VOLUNTEERS OF THE CREATIVE SOCIETY DO:

- Global disaster monitoring. Volunteers monitor events related to disasters and natural
 calamities worldwide using open sources. Regular reports are provided to the public
 every week.
- Analytics and data visualization. In-depth analysis of climate and geodynamic events, featuring clear, informative graphs.
- Collaboration with leading scientists and experts. Volunteers regularly conduct interviews and interact with scientists and experts to gain deep knowledge about current climatic and geodynamic events.
- Interaction with eyewitnesses and climate refugees. Volunteers conduct interviews, providing a platform for disaster survivors and those facing climate challenges to share their stories.
- Environmental analysis. Volunteers conduct studies to assess the impact of natural disasters on the environment and ecosystems.
- International forums and conferences. Volunteers organize international forums and conferences, which are simultaneously interpreted into 150 languages, aimed at discussing pressing issues and finding solutions together with experts and the public.

REPORT ON THE PROGRESSION AND CONSEQUENCES OF CLIMATIC DISASTERS

In recent years, there has been a rapid increase in the number of climate disasters on the planet. Disasters occur suddenly and in areas where they were not previously observed, causing enormous damage and human losses. Currently, natural disasters show a stable trend of growth, synchronous pattern, and expanding geographic impact. This report provides an analysis of the progression of climate and geodynamic changes on Earth over the last 30 years, as well as their interrelation with additional anthropogenic factors that significantly exacerbate the climate situation on the planet. The unique data presented in this report give humanity the opportunity to evaluate the time remaining to make responsible decisions and necessary efforts to overcome the climate crisis.
